Supplementary Regulations

*** ALL COMPETITORS ARE REQUIRED TO COMPLY WITH COVID REGULATIONS AND GUIDELINES ***

1. Omagh Motor Club will organise a Multi Event Autotest on Saturday 8th January 2021.
A Clubman Permit Autotest and Production Car Autotest and an Autosolo at Omagh Agricultural Show grounds, Drumquin Road Omagh. Autosolo will be all forward tests.
2. The Meeting will be held under the General Regulations of the Motorsport UK, (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions that the organising club may issue for the event.
3. Motorsport UK Permits are as follows. Autotest, Production Car, Autosolo
4. The event is open to all fully elected members of Omagh Motor Club.
All competitors must produce a valid membership card and Competition Licence. The minimum grade is an RS Clubman, which is free and can be applied for online. A digital licence is then sent via email. Club membership is £10.00
5. The event is a round of the **Omagh Motor Club's Traders Trophy**.
6. The programme of the meeting will be:-
Scrutineering starts at 11am
First car starts at 12 noon.
Social distancing guidelines must be adhered to at all times during the event
7. The events shall consist of the following classes,

Class A	(A)	Front-wheel drive sports cars and front-wheel drive specials
Class B	(B)	Rear-wheel drive sports cars and rear-wheel drive specials
Class C	(C)	Saloons under 11' 8" (3556 mm) in length (manufacturer's catalogue length)
Class D	(D)	Saloons of 11' 8" (3556 mm), or greater in length (see manufacturer's catalogue)

Clubman A	(CA)	Front-wheel drive Lightweight cars
Clubman B	(CB)	Rear-wheel drive Lightweight cars
Clubman C	(CC)	Front-wheel drive road going cars*
Clubman D	(CD)	Rear-wheel drive road going cars*

Advanced A	(AA)	Front-wheel drive Lightweight cars
Advanced B	(AB)	Rear-wheel drive Lightweight cars
Advanced C	(AC)	Front-wheel drive road going cars*
Advanced D	(AD)	Rear-wheel drive road going cars*

Autosolo (All forward, passenger optional) including Juniors

(SF)	Front-wheel drive
(SR)	Rear-wheel drive

Omagh Motor Club reserve the right to amend the award categories or amalgamate classes and events.

Awards will be presented as follows:-

- 1st Overall (forfeits the Class Award)
- 1st in Class (if 3 or more starters)
- 2nd in Class (if 5 or more starters)
- 3rd in Class (if 8 or more starters)

8. The entry list opens on receipt of these regulations. Entries must be made on the official entry form, accompanied by the appropriate fee and received by Saturday 8th January 2022.

The entry fee for entries received by that date is £30

"Dual entries" are permitted

10. The maximum entry for the Meeting, including reserves, is 50. The minimum is 15.
Should the above minimum figure not be reached the organisers have the right to either cancel the Meeting, or amalgamate classes as necessary. The entries will be accepted in order of receipt. Entry fees may be refunded at the organisers' discretion.

12. Provisional results will be published as soon as possible following the end of the event, and a copy of the Final Results will be available on ANICC and Omagh Motor Club websites.

13. Any protest must be lodged in accordance with Motorsport UK Regulation C5.1 – 5.7.

14.

- (a) Details of Tests will be available to download prior to the event.
- (b) The timing will be by means of automatic timing equipment, recording seconds and tenths of seconds. Manual stopwatches will be used in the event of equipment failure.
- (c) The starting signal will be verbal.
- (d) The order of attempting tests will be numerical.
- (e) Competitors must run in order, unless permission is granted by the C.O.C. Failure to comply may result in a 30 second penalty.
- (f) If a car breaks down and is repaired, the driver will rejoin at the end of the class for the remainder of the event. Other drivers MUST not wait for the car to be repaired.

15. Practising will not be allowed. Drivers will be permitted to walk tests only on their first visit to each test-site.

16. Penalties will be as follows:-

- a) Not reporting at drivers briefing = 5 seconds. MSA Regulation H33.1.3
 - b) Not attempting test when instructed = 5 seconds. MSA Table M.7.
 - c) Pylons: Any contact = 5 seconds per offence.
 - d) Lines: Failure to stop astride a line as required = 5 seconds per offence.
 - e) Failure to attempt to cross a line = Fail.
 - f) A maximum penalty will be applied if a competitor crosses, with both leading wheels, a marked test line in the wrong direction, out of the prescribed sequence or too many/few times, otherwise competitors may correct their mistakes by returning to the point where they deviated from the test diagram.
 - g) Garages - All wheels must be inside the 4 garage lines, otherwise line penalties will be incurred.
- Note: A "Fail" is deemed to be fastest in that class plus 20 seconds. One entrant in a class and a test is failed, that entrant must repeat the test and 20 seconds including any penalties will be added to the time. There will be a Maximum Time for each test, which will be the fastest time in class plus 20 seconds.

17. All other General Regulations of the Motorsport UK apply as written except for the following which are modified:-

- a) Pylons may be less than one metre in height. Motorsport UK Regulation M4.2
- b) Cars need not be licensed. Motorsport UK Regulation M17.1
- c) Tyres from List 1B & 1C are not permitted.
- d) All competing vehicles must carry a small spill-kit, complying with J5.20.13. [M16.7.1]

18. Provisional results will be published during the event via Stop Astride Live smart phone app. Final results will be available after the event. Competitors are responsible for the accuracy of the times entered on the smart phone app. Time Cards will not be issued during the event. Competitors may record their times on their own paper if they would like to.

19. Competitors are reminded that all disputes must be addressed to the Clerk of the Course and not the test site officials. Video evidence or other such media not under the control of the organising club will not be admissible when resolving any dispute.

20. In the event of a tie, this will be resolved by comparing total penalties accrued by each competitor after the first visit to each test site. If this fails to resolve the tie, then the total penalties accrued on the second visit to each test site will be considered, and so on until the tie is resolved.

21. Competitors are reminded of noise limits – Motorsport UK Regulation J5.17.1-8 & J5.18.1-11
